

CHURCH'S ROLE IN YOUR COMMUNITY

Churches and Christian faith based community projects play an active role in the life of Dudley Borough. For example they are our communities largest youth service provider and touch the lives of over 9,000 children and young people each week. The Black Country Food Bank provides 'stop gap' provisions for those in desperate need. In 2015 they supplied 8000 meals. The Church provides support for all ages, from Mums & Tots to Meals for the elderly. In fact the 2007 Faith Survey revealed that faith communities contribute the equivalent of £8m to the health and wellbeing of the borough.
